







The BIG Picture:

Supporting more people while revenue remains nearly flat

100% of the people on Cuyahoga DD's waiver waiting list had their needs assessed

Statewide Transitional Waiting List Rule requires county boards of DD to assess people on their waiver waiting lists

1,524 assessments completed
